St Bernadette's Catholic Primary School – 2016 Treasurer's Report

On behalf of the St Bernadette's School Board, I would like to present the Treasurer's Report for 2016.

Firstly, I wish to recognise the efforts of both Kirstine McDonnell and Annie Redburn. Under the direction of our Principal Steve Gibbs, Annie and Kirstine have effectively managed a tight budget, which has enabled the School Board to make knowledgeable and sound financial decisions this year.


This has been a successful year. We had budgeted for 452 students between Kindergarten and Year 6 for 2016 and we have finished the year with 459. As a result the school received an additional \$11,254 in Per Capita Grants from the Commonwealth Government.


Receipt of school fees has slowed during the year as the effect of the economic downturn was felt by our families. As always, Mr Gibbs has been active in assisting parents to seek payment options that will help them maintain their child's place at the school until they can recover from their difficulties. At present, there is approximately \$7,000 more outstanding in current Fees and Charges than at this time last year. The Board is kept fully informed of the situation and is monitoring it.

However, the school has been very active in keeping close control of expenditure. As a result there are currently no areas of expenditure that are over budget for the year. The school's level of expenditure has also been reduced because we have retired another Loan – the second fully paid loan in 18 months.


It is anticipated that the small budgeted surplus of \$19,000 will be achieved, and possibly exceeded.

The school has been helped a great deal by the increase in the Government Grants. In 2016 we have received a total of \$3.543 million in per capita grants from the State and Federal Governments. In 2015 we received a total of \$3.345 million in Per Capita Grants and are expecting the Grants to rise again in 2017.





The Catholic Education Office of WA has issued the school with a "Capacity to Contribute" figure. This is the recommended amount of fees which each school is required to charge. At present our fees are slightly more than that. In view of the increase in Government Grant funding for the school, the Board has decided to maintain the Fees and Amenities charges at the 2016 level.



Budget 2017

As mentioned above it is anticipated that the school will receive substantially more in Grant Funding in 2017. It is my pleasure to announce that the budgeted surplus for 2017 is \$153,550.

However, it should be noted that CEO requires that school's finish the year with enough funds in the bank to cover the first 2 pays of the following year. When this is taken into account, the school is still showing a deficit result as in previous years. The deficit is expected to be \$161,992. However, it should be noted that the deficit for 2016 was \$234,750 so we will have substantially improved our position. The Board is hopeful that with a further year of conservative spending the school will shortly return to an overall surplus, and can begin to save for future developments.

To Fiona Perry and Jamie Dabinet, the school community thank you for the time and care you take in ensuring all children have a choice of thoughtful and precious gifts on the Mother's Day stall. This is a huge undertaking and they both willingly volunteer to arrange all gifts ahead of time, to bring happiness to families. To those who assist on the day and in arranging the presents into class groups, thank you. Every class had orders taken with over 300 gifts purchased. This is a great example of a community event that is aimed at reaching many families in the school.

Term Three

Before we knew it we were in term three which is the time of the year for the Father's Day stall. Jamie Dabinet and Fiona Perry again made sure all students had an excellent range from which to choose. We are grateful for the time and effort you give and that it takes to arrange the stall as it brings so much joy for students to think about the person they love; to give a gift. All grades placed orders, which shows the popularity and importance of these stalls. The gifts are good value for money and are affordable for students. To those who helped on the day and 'behind the scenes,' our thanks extends to you also.

Next, to one of our favourite events for the year, the movie afternoon. Over 200 tickets were sold with students from our school filling a cinema, sharing popcorn, lollies and choc bombs. The Secret Life of Pets was a massive success especially with Tracey Morandin securing a movie member deal and bonuses for all who attended. Thank you to Caroline McMullen and her helpers for her patience and attention to detail in ensuring all tickets were delivered to the correct classes and families. The students who attended were so excited to see their friends in an 'out of school' environment that was fun, happy and relaxed.

So here we are in term four. The term that always seems to fly by quicker than any other I am sure you will agree. The Parents and Friends held our annual

school disco. The junior disco and the senior disco accommodated over 300 students that danced, sang, wore themselves out and had a marvelous time with friends. To Bob Henry and Lee-Anne Seuren you have continued to manage an efficient, enjoyable and hugely positive event. We thank you as you hand the reins over to the new disco committee of Lisa Law, Narelle Kenly, Nicola Evans and Jenni Smith.

The most recent Parents and Friends run event was the bike raffle and sausage sizzle. These events are only successfully run with a large number of helpers who continue to volunteer their time, enthusiasm and energy. To all who helped out yesterday, thank you. Special mention to Rodney Robinson from RJ Butchers in Baldivis, for providing the sausages at cost, to Katherine Bunce for organising the volunteers and to Tracey Scott and her helpers for arranging the raffle. Our Thank yous would not be complete without mentioning Paul Papalia who donated the BMX bike to our school.

Next week the Parents and Friends will be welcoming in the newest Parents and Friends members: the kindy parents. We will be hosting a morning tea in the library to encourage community within the school.

Two ongoing projects that run for the full four terms of the school year are the scholastic book club and school banking.

On average there are 80 weekly bankers. Apart from encouraging student to take a positive interest in money and saving, Lorelle Kursar and Caroline McAndrew are welcoming and friendly to all students they meet. Testament to their dedication and diligence is the fact that St Bernadette's sits in the top ten for schools who bank in the program. Thank you to them both for their dedication to this task each week in ensuring the money is balanced, that rewards are ordered and that students enjoy the banking experience.

Book club runs each term and would not be possible without the commitment and initiative of Katherine Bunce with the help of Margie Gray. Through book club student are encouraged to choose books and to read for enjoyment.

For all orders placed, St Bernadette's accrues credit that can be used with scholastic to purchase lexile readers, teacher resources and a range of fiction and non-fiction texts. This year alone the value of book club benefit to the school has been in excess of \$2400 with over \$700 accrued for 2017 already.

All fundraising efforts and commissions across all terms and including banking has been directly allocated to the major capital works involved in the Nature playground. The Parents and Friends of St. Bernadette's are pleased to be part of this new structure and look forward to the students engaging in play in this new space.

None of these events would have been possible without the teamwork and commitment of our Parents and Friends committee, class representatives and the many parents who give their time freely. Principal's 2016 AGM Address

2016 has been another very busy and rewarding year. It seems this date comes around quicker and quicker each new year and I am surprised by the amount of time that passes by so rapidly and the events that we manage to fit in. The AGM is very much about reflection on the year that was and an opportunity to look forward with optimism and enthusiasm to the new year ahead.

As part of System and Government regulations I am required to report to the community on a number of key performance indicators. Whilst this is published in June annually on the school website, I will take the opportunity to report to you on some of this information that relates to the 2015 school year. I will also talk about the year that has been and highlight some of the activities of the school and staff, this will also include a brief presentation on NAPLAN results past and present. Finally I will share the future direction for the school, including some financial commitments and staffing for 2017.

At the conclusion of the 2015 school year one staff member left the school and the staffing qualifications were as follows; Diploma of Education (4), Bachelor degrees (13) Masters of Education (8). Student attendance in 2015 was at an average rate of 93% with this being spread relatively evenly across year levels. 90% of graduating Year 6 students went on to attend Kolbe Catholic College with the remainder attending a variety of Catholic and Independent schools, with a small percentage going on to a DET school. This is a brief snapshot of school performance indicators and the full report is available on the school's website.

This year has seen the staff involved in a variety of professional development activities. Whole school professional development around the school focus of grammar and punctuation and writing was undertaken in the form of two whole school professional development days, a shared religious education day occurred with schools in our region and some time was spent on our school focus of feedback. We also continued our focus on teaching strategies shown by research to have an impact on student learning. We also took part in a regional conference for Peel region schools at Assumption Catholic Primary School.

Students achieving above the national benchmark in NAPLAN testing continues at a stable rate. Our 2016 Year Three cohort is again strong and have this year performed exceptionally well across the board. It is pleasing to see this result as it is the fourth year running we have had a strong Year Three result. Our Year Five results show the amazing work we do in lifting and supporting the students in the lower end of our cohort. Looking at the percentage of students above the minimum standard it is clear that our school is progressing in this area every year. Our challenge as a staff that we have identified is to find a way to replicate this strong growth for all of our students. This will form the basis of our focus in 2017. This national test must be looked at in context however as it provides information on a limited aspect of a child's learning and development and is but one piece of the assessment pie.

Our staffing for 2016 is as follows. (See powerpoint slides). At this point I would like to acknowledge staff members who are leaving. Gail Anton will be leaving us at the end of this year. Gail is a highly respected long term member of staff who has been at the school since 1997. Gail will be retiring to her dream property in the Perth Hills. We will all miss Gail's experience, professionalism and ability to speak her mind with clarity and confidence. I wish her all the best for the future. Recently Deborah Glorie was successful in obtaining a teaching position at Hammond Park CPS. This will be an exciting opportunity as Hammond Park is still a school in its infancy. We wish Deb all the best.

Claire Bennett will be taking the year off in 2017 as part of a salary sacrifice arrangement. I'm sure she will enjoy her time away even though it may be busier for her with all of her commitments to her grandchildren booking up as we speak.

I would like to thank the Assistant Principals, Cath Flynn and Deb Addison for the way they have continued to support and assist me in decision making and direction for the school. Unfortunately both of these highly experienced and valued members of staff are leaving the role. Cath is stepping back from AP and Deb is moving to Star of the Sea Rockingham. To start at a school and have such wonderful support has been fantastic and one of the reasons our school operates so well is due to the team nature and approach of our leadership group. Words will not adequately express how much I will miss these two wonderful ladies and the support and advice they have given me. It has been an absolute honour to work with them and I wish them both every success for their new roles.

Teresa McFarlane and Maureen Wall have also been invaluable as part of the wider leadership team in the school and their support has been very much appreciated. Teresa will also be changing her role next year and I know she will do a wonderful job with our Kindergarten cohort.

The frontline staff of Annie Redburn, Lynne Sadler and Kirstine McDonnell have been a pleasure to work with and have been a great help in keeping the office running smoothly and efficiently. They are also often the first taste visitors and new families get of our school and they do a great job at building a welcoming and inviting environment. Our school is fortunate to have a dedicated, hard-working, professional and supportive staff. It is often the case that in the busyness of the year there is little time to stop and reflect on the roles we all play in children's lives every day and how important this role is. I very much appreciate and thank every one of you for your contribution to the education of the wonderful children in our care.

The relationship the school has with the parish is a tangible and real connection with many of our staff being parishioners. This is something I discuss as a strength in our school at enrolment interviews and recently when speaking with Father Gavin and Bishop Don Sproxton. I have had the pleasure of continuing to work with Father Gavin and his support of our students and staff is outstanding. I look forward to continuing to develop and strengthen our important relationship with the Parish.

I have again had the pleasure of working with a fantastic Board and P&F and have appreciated the encouragement, support and sound advice from this dedicated and professional group of people. This year Kylie Henning, Lee Cousins and Paul Onoforo all finish their time on the board. Kylie and Lee have continued on even though their children have finished at the school. This is an indication of their dedication and desire to assist the St Bernadette's community. Schools cannot function without these important volunteers and I thank the new board members for nominating for a position.

I very much look forward to another year and working collaboratively to get the best results for the wonderful students of St Bernadette's.
