



## UNIFORM GUIDELINES

School-based guidelines are not variations to CEWA Executive Directives. They enact contextual decisions and have the legal obligation of CECWA policy for people acting under the authority of the principal. Guidelines are used when there are multiple ways of correctly delivering on a task and there is a need to take environment, situational awareness and discretion into account in deciding the appropriate course of action.

Please note this document is to be read in conjunction with the CECWA Policy [Community](#) and the Executive Directive – [Student Safety, Wellbeing and Behaviour](#).

### **PURPOSE:**

St Bernadette's uniform is tangible evidence of the standards expected of students and plays an important role in promoting a positive image of the school. The uniform supports all students to participate fully in school life and helps create a sense of identity and school culture.

The wearing of school uniform is compulsory. Parents indicate their support of the school uniform on their child's enrolment form.

### **GUIDELINES:**

The School Uniform must be worn appropriately and with pride by students during school hours, travelling to and from school, out in the community such as shopping centres and as directed for school functions.

### **SCHOOL UNIFORM:**

- SBCPS red shirt with crest
- SBCPS Navy blue gaberdine shorts OR SBCPS navy blue skort with crest
- SBCPS navy blue track pants with crest
- SBCPS navy blue track top with crest

### **SPORTS UNIFORM** (to be worn on Sport Days, Sports Carnivals and when directed by staff):

- SBCPS Faction shirt with crest
- SBCPS navy blue micro fibre shorts with crest

### **GENERAL:**

- SBCPS hat with crest – compulsory all year round.
- White or Black or Black and White Sneakers (no colour permitted). This can include full white or full black shoes or black and white shoes. Canvas shoes are NOT permitted.
- SBCPS Socks.
- All students are required to have the SBCPS backpack.
- OPTIONAL – SBCPS navy blue wet weather jacket (to be worn over tracksuit top outside classroom only)
- Pre-Kindy and Kindy students are to wear their Kindy Shirt in lieu of the SBCPS red shirt with crest. All other Sports uniform guidelines apply.
- Year 6 students may wear Graduation shirts with their school uniform
- On 'Free Dress Days', clothes and footwear need to be appropriate to the occasion and hair must be tied up and off the face.

## **GROOMING:**

Students are expected to show pride in themselves and their school by paying attention to their personal appearance.

- Clothing is to be clean and in a good state of repair.
- Nail Polish and Make Up is not permitted.
- Clear lip balm/gloss may be worn.

## **HAIR:**

- Shoulder length hair or longer is to be tied back.
- Hair is to be tidy and away from the face.
- Hair Accessories- black, brown, navy blue or red.
- Any change to hair colour should be in natural toning only.
- Hairstyles are to be moderate and not extreme (Number 1 haircuts or chiselled pattern hair styles are considered extreme).
- No hair wraps and or bead/coloured braiding.

## **JEWELLERY:**

The only jewellery permitted is:

- Wristwatch / Smartwatches - Smartwatches are to be used as per iPad Code of Conduct Agreement.
- Earrings which are small sleepers or plain studs - one only in the lobe of the ear.
- One chain with religious symbol, to be worn under clothing.

**All uniforms, except shoes, are to be purchased through Hot Klobba - 5 Fielden Way, Port Kennedy.  
Second hand purchases must have the school crest and adhere to the same guidelines as stipulated in the policy above.**

**Please Note:** *Permission to vary from the uniform stipulation must be sought from the principal. If these guidelines are not followed, parents will be sent a direct message through SEQTA. If a student receives three messages within a term, parents will be called in for a meeting.*
